New Process of Remitting Monthly Fees; New Office Hours

After extensive discussions and considerations, the Edgewater board of managers has decided that it would be in our best interest to transfer responsibility for all bookkeeping and payroll functions from our on-site administrator to our accounting firm, Bahgat & Laurito-Bahgat (BLB). We believe this change would provide many advantages and benefits. Because bookkeeping will no longer take place in the office, starting April 1, 2011, your monthly association fees should be mailed directly to the accounting firm at the following address:

As a result of this change, our full-time administrator, Adele Harrington, will go part time effective April 1. During the spring and summer months, the office will be open from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. (except for lunch).

New Website Goes Live

Edgewater owners and residents now have access to a new website, a large portion of which is just for them. The website has been under development for several months. The new site is based on the results of the survey circulated late last summer; the survey showed there was a high interest in obtaining information from a website. While the old website served its purpose well, the new site offers an "information portal" just for owners and residents.

The new website can be found at the same address as the old one: <u>www.edgewatercondos.net</u>. The four main pages are labeled: "Home," "The Region," "Properties," and "Resident Info"; the navigation buttons are at the top right of each page. For the time being, pictures from the old site are being used on the new site; however, we hope to eventually replace these with updated photos of the four seasons. If you have any pictures of the Edgewater grounds you would like to submit for consideration, please send them to Ann Carden at: <u>arccom66@gmail.com</u>.

"The Region" page gives visitors and prospective buyers a glimpse of the area that surrounds Edgewater, including wine country, Barcelona Harbor, and Lake Chautauqua.

The "Properties" page describes the types of units (not individual units) available for sale and rental at Edgewater. Several realtors are listed, but we want to make sure this is a comprehensive list. If you are selling your unit and/or rent it out and your realtor/property manager is not listed, please forward the information to Ann.

We are especially excited about the "Resident Info" page, which requires a password: **edgeh2ores** (this is case sensitive; please note that the lower case letter "o" is used, not a zero). This will allow you to enter a microsite just for residents. The survey revealed a high interest in having access to monthly board minutes, budget reports, project costs, and special events, so this microsite was designed with that in mind. There also is a section for forms (e.g., maintenance requests, A/C installation) so you can easily download them.

Page labels for this section include: "Bylaws/Rules," "Forms," "Newsletters," "Minutes," "Budget Reports," and "Recreation and Social Committee." The navigation buttons are located on the left side of each page.

Please take some time to visit the new website, click around and see what was created based on what you told us you wanted. We hope it will become an instrumental tool in keeping you informed on what's happening at Edgewater.

Final Print Newsletter

The survey revealed that there is still interest in a monthly newsletter; the findings also showed that e-mail is the preferred method of receiving Edgewater information. As a result, starting in April, the newsletter will be accessed through the website. This will not only be a more effective mode of delivery, but it also will save on postage.

When a newsletter is available, you'll receive an e-mail notification with a link to the newsletter. We will use the e-mail list compiled by the Recreation and Social Committee last summer. If you did not submit an e-mail address or your e-mail has changed since then, please make sure you contact the office.
